Playing Golf in Hot Weather

Heatstroke, or "heat illness," is a serious condition that can affect golfers of all ages. Understanding how to prevent it is crucial for everyone on the course.

Heatstroke occurs when the body can't regulate its temperature due to high heat and humidity. Symptoms can escalate quickly and include confusion, seizures, elevated body temperature, excessive sweating or hot skin, vomiting, and nausea. If untreated, it can be life-threatening.

Preventive Steps:

Stay Hydrated - Drink plenty of water and sports drinks to replenish electrolytes.

Dress Appropriately - Wear lightcolored, loose-fitting clothing.

Seek Shade - Take breaks in shaded areas whenever possible.

Plan Your Tee Time - Play early to avoid peak heat.

Use a Golf Cart

<u>Steps to treat players suffering from</u> <u>heatstroke</u>

Call emergency services if symptoms are severe.

Try to move the player to a shaded area or bring an umbrella if they are unable to move

Use cold water to cool the player. If you are able, place wet towels in strategic areas like the groin, neck, head, and under the armpits and try circulating the air as much as possible by fanning.

If the player is conscious, give small sips of water. If the player in unconscious, place the player in the recovery position.

Do not leave the player; stay with them until they are well enough to move or help arrives.

Rules quiz

- Q1. Your ball comes to rest in a greenside bunker. In making the backswing for the stroke, you touch a leaf in the bunker with your club. What is the ruling?

- Q3. A player plays their second shot, searches for the ball briefly and then announces they will go back and play a provisional ball. - Q6 In stroke play, player A asks player B what the distance is to the centre of the green and if there is a bunker behind the green. Player B answers both questions. What is the penalty?
